Getting Around During Blue Line Revamp

The Metro Blue Line will undergo an update and renovations, which will require suspended service in sections starting Jan. 26. During station closures, buses will shuttle riders in place of rail service.

First to close (Jan. 26 to May) is the southern portion of the Blue Line—from downtown Long Beach to the Willowbrook/Rosa Parks Station (at the Green Line connection, which will remain unaffected).

Get regular updates on the project, including which stations are open or closed, shuttle options and more metro.net/newblue.



Riders are also encouraged to visit ridematch.info or call 511 to find alternatives such as carpool, vanpool or door-to-door transit itinerary information.

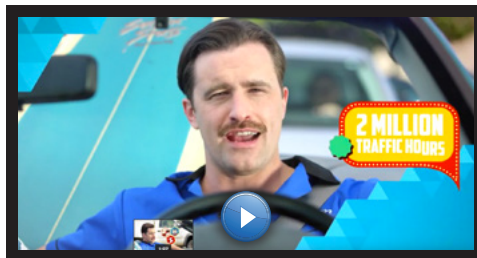
Catch Up on I-405 Construction News

The Metrolink Discount Is Now the Regular Fare!

A 25% discounted promotional fare that's been in effect since last May on the Metrolink San Bernardino Line is now the regular fare, as of Jan. 1. Since its introduction, ridership increased by 10%, leading to the Metrolink Board's decision to make it permanent.

Metrolink's San Bernardino Line connects downtown San Bernardino to Los Angeles Union Station through 14 stations and 57.6 route miles.
