SUBJECT: UPDATE ON THE FY 17/18 AND 18/19 STATE OF GOOD REPAIR PROGRAMS

RECOMMENDATION:

• Information and Discussion

BACKGROUND:

The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, Senate Bill (SB) 1, includes a program that provides additional revenues for transit maintenance, rehabilitation and capital projects. This investment in public transit is referred to as the State of Good Repair (SGR) program. The program provides approximately \$105 million annually to the State Transit Assistance (STA) Account for the State of Good Repair Program with funds distributed to Transit Operators using the same formula as State Transit Assistance.

DISCUSSION:

FY 17/18 SGR Program Update

Caltrans Approved Project List: Project lists for FY 17/18 SGR funds were submitted by local Transit Operators to Caltrans in January. Caltrans has posted the Approved Project List for FY 17/18 on the SGR website at <u>http://www.dot.ca.gov/drmt/spstasgr.html</u>. The list of projects approved for Ventura County Transit Operators is included in Attachment 1.

Allocation of Funds: VCTC, as the Regional Transportation Planning Agency/Transportation Commission is responsible for receiving and sub-allocating the SGR funds to the Transit Operators. For this first round of funding, the FY 17/18 apportionments will be disbursed by the State Controller's Office in two separate scheduled payments. The first allocation was issued by the State Controller's Office on May 24, 2018. VCTC will be working with individual Operators to process the funds.

FY 18/19 SGR Program

Project Lists Due September 1st, 2018: The estimated available funds for FY 18/19 for Ventura County Transit Operators is attached in the Controller's Letter dated January 31, 2018 (Attachment 2). The revised estimate is expected to be posted on the Caltrans "State of Good Repair" website on August 1st 2018.

Caltrans has released the Draft Guidelines for FY 18/19 for Comment. Comments are due by June 19th. Under the proposed new Guidelines, to avoid a loss of apportioned funds, a list of projects for FY18/19 must be submitted to Caltrans by September 1st. Additionally, the draft Guidelines call for Transit Operators to providing their annual list of projects to VCTC instead of Caltrans and VCTC will be responsible for submitting one list from the County to Caltrans. SUBJECT: REVISION TO PROPOSITION 1B TRANSIT CAPITAL PROGRAM

RECOMMENDATION:

• Approve reprogramming City of Simi Valley Proposition 1B Transit Capital Fund project balances totaling \$24,041 from the Paratransit Vehicle Purchase Project to the City of Simi Valley CNG Fueling Facility Project.

DISCUSSION:

On April 3, 2015, the Commission approved programming \$1,250,000 of FY 14/15 Proposition 1B Transit Capital funds to purchase Replacement Paratransit Vehicles for the City of Simi Valley. The vehicles have now been purchased and the project is complete with a balance of \$24,041. The City of Simi Valley would like to use the funds for the Proposition 1B funded CNG Fueling Facility Project. It is therefore recommended that TRANSCOM approve reprogramming the Proposition 1B project balance along with any accrued interest to construct the Simi Valley CNG Fueling Facility.
