**Cycle 4 Active Transportation Program - Update:**

At the January meeting, the Technical Advisory Committee approved the prioritization of the 11 Cycle 4 ATP projects submitted from Ventura County. At their February 1, 2019 meeting the Ventura County Transportation Commission approved the attached list of projects recommended for funding under the MPO Component. The schedule calls for the recommended list of projects to be considered by the SCAG Regional Council at their April 4<sup>th</sup> meeting and for final approval by the California Transportation Commission at their June meeting.

Unfunded projects will remain on the list. The List will serve as a Contingency List of Projects should funds be made available through project cancellations or savings (subject to CTC approval).

**ATP Cycle 5:**

The Call-for-Projects is scheduled for June of 2020.
