#### Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act)

- Section 1440 of the FAST Act authorized Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to reimburse recipients and subrecipients for preliminary engineering (PE) cost incurred prior to project authorization
- On March 19, 2019, FHWA issued a Memorandum titled "At-Risk Project Pre-Agreement Authority for Preliminary Engineering" which clarifies Section 1440
- On August 11, 2020, the Division of Local Assistance issued Office Bulletin #20-03, At Risk Preliminary Engineering



## Eligibility

- At Risk PE only applies to allowable preconstruction development and engineering costs
- Does NOT include
  - Planning
  - Right-of-Way Acquisition
  - Construction
- An Authorization for At-Risk PE must be processed prior to actual reimbursement of PE expenses



## Eligibility

- If eligible, and once federal authorization is received, incurred costs can be reimbursed back to the effective date of the FAST Act, October 1, 2015 or the federal approval date to the Federal Statewide Transpiration Improvement Program (FSTIP), whichever occurs later
- Project and PE Phase must be included in a federallyapproved FSTIP
  - Must supply date of approved FSTIP or approved amendment prior to start of work (Original FSTIP listing).
    - Does not need to show PE as Federally funded
  - Must supply FSTIP listing at time of Authorization
    - Funds must be shown as federal




# Eligibility

- Locals must meet all federal requirements
  - LAPM 10-C
  - DBE
  - ICRP
- Does NOT apply to projects with federal funds prior to an allocation by the CTC.
  - May invoke Section 1440 <u>after</u> the CTC has allocated the federal funds
- NEPA environmental review can begin without demonstrating full funding.
  - Subsequent phases must be included in the approved FSTIP before the NEPA document be signed.




## Timing (pre At-Risk PE)



### At-Risk PE versus AC

- AC may be used for any phase. Section 1440 (At-Risk PE) only applies to PE
- After AC approval, the project moves forward with nonfederal funds
  - No prior approval is required for At Risk-PE
- Federal eligible costs after AC Authorization are eligible for reimbursement
  - Eligible costs for At-Risk PE are effective to the date of the FSTIP
- Both require FHWA authorization prior to reimbursement of funds.



## 10-Year PE Rule

- The At-Risk PE does not change the 10-Year PE rule
  - The 10-year period starts at the end of the fiscal year that FHWA authorized the PE.
- Projects not making use of the At-Risk PE, the 10-year period starts with the authorization of PE.
- Project using At-Risk PE, the 10-year period does not immediately start. It starts when the At-Risk PE authorization is approved by FHWA.
  - The time that PE occurred before the At-Risk Authorization does not count against the 10-year rule

## Summary

- Office Bulletin #20-03 was issued on August 11, 2020
- Applies only to PE
- Policy is retroactive to the effective date of the FAST-ACT, October 1, 2015
- PE phase must be in an approved FSTIP document or amendment (agency must keep a copy of the FSTIP in their file showing the original programmed PE funds)



## Summary

- Reimbursement is allowed for PE costs incurred prior to project authorization, assuming the costs are for otherwise eligible activities
- Incurred costs can be reimbursed back to the effective date of the FAST Act, October 1, 2015 or the federal approval date of the FSTIP, whichever occurs later
- LAPM 3-A (Authorization) has been updated to include the At-Risk PE.
- FADS and LP2000 require an Effective PE Reimbursement Date
