

Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 5





The Active Transportation Program (ATP) was established in 2013 by the state legislature to encourage increased use of active modes of transportation, such as **biking and walking**.

The California Transportation Commission (CTC) announced the Cycle 5 ATP call-for-projects with an overall budget of \$446 million for a four-year program.

454 statewide applicants submitted projects requesting over \$2.3 billion in ATP grant funds, **5 x the available funding.**

Ventura County agencies submitted 7 applications.





Project Selection:

Statewide competitive program (40% of overall Cycle 5 ATP funds or \$220M).

Applications are scored and ranked by CTC/Caltrans. Of the 454 projects submitted Statewide, 41 projects were selected for funding.

For the first time in the history of the state's Active Transportation Program, a Ventura County project was approved by CTC staff to receive statewide funding, the

El Rio Pedestrian Improvement and Safe Routes to School project awarded \$6,195,000 in ATP funds to build over 4 miles of sidewalk in the El Rio community.





Metropolitan Planning Organization (SCAG) Regional Component

Projects not selected for statewide funding are considered for the County share of the MPO (SCAG) Component (60% of overall funding or \$89M).

Ventura County's 7 applicants requested more than \$38M in ATP funding for a populationbased share of \$3.96 million






City of Oxnard's Safe Routes to School Project installs crosswalks and other pedestrian safety features at six local schools








City of Oxnard 4th Street Mobility Improvements in downtown Oxnard near the Oxnard Transit Center
