ITEM 1 CALL TO ORDER

Chair Miller called the meeting to order at 1:31 p.m. via Zoom Webinar.

ITEM 2 INTRODUCTIONS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

Tyler Nestved announced that he has been hired by the City of Thousand Oaks and that his replacement with the City of Camarillo is Jason Samonte. Shaun Kroes, City of Moorpark, announced the commencement of the Moorpark Metrolink station north parking lot construction project, which will affect the shared VCTC bus stop. Tim Bochum, City of Oxnard, announced his resignation. Martin Erickson, VCTC, announced the promotion of Dolores Lopez to the Regional Transit Planner position. Mr. Bonfilio, VCTC, announced the Valley Express Stuff the Bus event.

ITEM 3 PUBLIC COMMENT None.

ITEM 4 AGENDA ADJUSTMENTS None.

ITEM 5 APPROVAL OF NOVEMBER MEETING MINUTES

ACTION

Gonzalez moved, seconded by Kroes, that the Committee approve the November 10, 2021 meeting minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

ITEM 6 VCBUSPASS FARE CAPPING PROGRAM

Mr. Bonfilio, VCTC, described fare capping and the benefits it affords low-income transit riders. He said that he will bring an item for the Committee to review in early 2022.

Discussion:

Mr. Nestved shared that the timing is cause for concern as the City of Camarillo recently raised fares. Ms. Arrieta shared that Thousand Oaks Transit does not support a VCbuspass fare capping program. Mr. Ben Gonzalez, City of Simi Valley, offered support for the program. Mr. Miller said that Gold Coast Transit District is in support of fare capping and said that it only helps the rider.

ITEM 7 COVID-19 TRANSIT UPDATE

Mr. Erickson, VCTC, shared that VCTC will be extending its half-fare promotion through June 2022 and asked the committee if they have any updates related to Covid-19.

Discussion:

Mr. Bonfilio said that he will be meeting with GCTD staff to discuss best practices when interacting with people that are unhoused, mentally ill, and/or addicted to drugs/alcohol. Chair Miller said that GCTD anticipates overcoming the driver/staff shortages by mid-spring 2022.

ITEM 8 INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT & JOBS ACT (IIJA)

Peter De Haan, VCTC, provided the Committee with highlights from the IIJA including funding increases for NOLO and SGR programs, application requirements, and the February 2022 application deadline. He also said that the Urbanized Areas (UZA) may be changed following the most recent census. Ms. Peschka said that the FTA has published fact sheets by program on their website.

Discussion:

The Committee discussed the potential effects of UZA changes including the Cities of Simi Valley and/or Camarillo being absorbed by a larger urbanized area

SUBJECT: VENTURA COUNTY AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN PRESENTATION

ACTION

Receive and Discuss

BACKGROUND

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) strengthened the federal ozone standard on October 1, 2015. The National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for ozone was established to protect the environment and public health. Ventura County was designated as a "serious" non-attainment area for the ozone pollutant and must attain the NAAQS by year 2027. The Ventura County Air Pollution Control District (VCAPCD) is currently developing a revised Air Quality Management Plan (AQMP) to demonstrate attainment of the 2015 8-hour ozone NAAQS. The AQMP is due to EPA by August 3, 2022. The AQMP submittal to EPA will become the Ventura County portion of the State Implementation Plan (SIP) to meet the 2015 8-hour ozone NAAQS. Staff from VCAPCD will be making a presentation to TRANSCOM on this issue.

Mobile sources consist of a large portion of the emissions contributing to the air quality problem in Ventura County. The AQMP outlines the control measures needed to meet the ozone NAAQS by the year 2027. Transportation Control Measures (TCMs) play an important role in reducing on-road mobile source emissions by reducing the number of vehicle trips and vehicle miles traveled. The Clean Air Act requires a review of Reasonable Available Control Measures (RACM) and Transportation Conformity to ensure TCMs are developed and implemented in a timely manner.

A RACM analysis is required during the AQMP development process. An extensive list of existing and potential TCMs are evaluated to determine whether the individual TCMs are technologically or economically feasible for Ventura County. A RACM analysis is being prepared by the District and will be used as a starting point to determine if additional TCMs are feasible for Ventura County. When TCMs are established and funded, the federal Transportation Conformity regulation ensures their timely implementation and continued funding. Because TCMs play an important role in meeting the ozone NAAQS by 2027, conformity to the goals and strategies of the AQMP/SIP is required from transportation plans, programs, and projects.

SUBJECT: EXPEDITED PROGRAMMING OF CONGESTION MITGATION AND AIR QUALITY (CMAQ) FUNDS FROM THE INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT AND JOBS ACT (IIJA) FOR BUS REPLACEMENT INFRASTRUCTURE

RECOMMENDATION:

 Recommend the Commission program \$11,346,444 in IIJA CMAQ funds as recommended in the Attachment A table.

BACKGROUND:

VCTC's most recent CMAQ call for projects was in 2017. In 2018, VCTC approved additional CMAQ for projects that could obligate the balance quickly to avoid a rescission scheduled for September 2019. Then, in 2020 the federal government extended the transportation authorization by one year, and to use the additional year of CMAQ funds the Commission approved projects through an expedited project selection rather than a formal call for projects. Through these three programming actions, the Commission programmed nearly all of the CMAQ money authorized through the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act.

The November 2021 passage of a new federal authorization, entitled the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), authorizes another five years of transportation programs including CMAQ, for fiscal years 2021/22 – 2025/26. VCTC staff therefore expects over the next few months to initiate a CMAQ call for projects. That process would typically start with developing revised guidelines, followed by issuance of the call for projects to program the five years of CMAQ funds authorized by the IIJA, and then scoring of applications and submittal of the recommended projects to the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) for inclusion in the Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP). As discussed with the Committee last month, the CMAQ call for projects process could be changed from prior cycles depending on the outcome of the work by Caltrans, SCAG, and the other multi-county Metropolitan Planning Organizations to comply with the recent Corrective Action issued by the Federal Highway Administration regarding the issue of suballocating funds within multi-county regions. In last year's expedited programming process for the FY 2020/21 CMAQ funds, VCTC and TRANSCOM became aware of the need for additional bus replacements beyond the funds available at that time. Since addressing the need for transit bus replacement and supporting infrastructure is a clear priority, the passage of the IIJA provides the opportunity to quickly move forward with the scheduled vehicle replacements, without having to wait for the pending call for projects process. Therefore, at the last TRANSCOM meeting, the Committee directed staff to query the transit operators regarding their needs for vehicle replacement and related needs scheduled in the asset management plans. The intent was to limit the agency requests to projects that can have approved CMAQ fund transfers, and hopefully FTA grants, processed by November 1, 2022.

DISCUSSION:

As shown in the Attachment A table, a total of \$27,397,444 was requested for CMAQ-eligible capital purchases. This list includes not only the transit capital replacement needs submitted by operators, but also VCTC's annual amounts for countywide transit outreach and regional ridesharing. Staff is recommending approval of \$11,346,444 of this amount. The remaining project proposals can be considered should they be submitted for the upcoming IIJA call for projects.

It is important for TRANSCOM to be aware that the total requested amount of \$27,397,444 is well more than 50% of the total CMAQ authorized over five years by the IIJA. Although the new call for projects guidelines have not yet been developed, in the past the practice was to provide 50% of the available CMAQ funds for transit. VCTC staff roughly estimates that over the next five years Ventura County will receive \$46.7 million of CMAQ funds. Given the significant need for not only bus replacement but also conversion to zero-emission buses, and with the lack of a significant local funding source, the required bus replacements can only happen if Ventura County transit operators successfully pursue competitive grants. Fortunately, the IIJA significantly increases competitive grants available for this purpose, and the state also has significant competitive grant funds available. As VCTC programs CMAQ funds going forward, it will need to consider strategies for how to best position, to the extent possible, the County's transit operators to compete for the competitive grants, despite the lack of local funds.

Given that the IIJA CMAQ funding is insufficient to cover all the current requests, staff is recommending funding all but three of the projects. The recommended projects will replace the oldest buses, and also provide the charging infrastructure for Thousand Oaks to move forward with its plan to convert to electric buses starting with the currently-needed replacements. The \$10,267,444 in recommended funding for bus capital replacement will still use over 40% of the available funds consisting of 50% of the five years of IIJA CMAQ funding.

- SUBJECT: STATUS OF FEDERAL CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY (CMAQ) PROJECTS

RECOMMENDATION:

• Review and file.

DISCUSSION:

Under federal law, CMAQ funds apportioned to California lapse if they are not used within three years. AB 1012, which became law in October 1999, applies the three-year lapsing rule to CMAQ funds in each county. It is important for VCTC to have an accurate schedule of CMAQ (Attachments 1 and 2, respectively) projects to ensure that our region does not lose funds. VCTC also uses this project schedule to ensure that the Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) includes all of the projects which are ready-to-go, and to manage the county's Obligational Authority (OA).

Attached is the current status of obligation projects during the current Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) as well as anticipated for future years. The table includes projects from previous CMAQ programming rounds as well as the bus asset replacement projects recommended for funding at this time. The Committee is requested to provide staff with any updates as changes occur.
