On March 17, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order N-29-20 suspending certain provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act to allow local legislative bodies to conduct their meetings completely telephonically or by other electronic means. Ms. Heather Miller, VCTC, announced upcoming ATP workshops, the 'Pro Housing Incentive,' and encouraged agency staff to attend the upcoming ATP application workshop to be hosted by the CTC in February.

Mr. Peter De Haan, VCTC, announced that Mr. Martin Erickson, VCTC, has transitioned from his role as the Public Transit Director to Executive Director.

Ms. Amanda Fagan, VCTC, announced that the Comprehensive Transportation Plan's youth, family, and community engagement effort throughout the months of February including a community walk audit of neighborhoods, school routes, etc. She said that the data would be made public and that participants are eligible to win a \$50 gift card.

The committee received a brief presentation on the StreetsLA Cool Streets Pilot Program including the Heat Island Effect, benefits of cooling community streets.

The committee discussed 1) how pavement markings are addressed, 2) the number of coats/applications required, 3) slip resistance, 4) neighborhood heat island inequity, 5) pricing, and 6) challenges associated with planting and establishing street trees.

ITEM 10 VENTURA COUNTY AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN PRESENTATION

Mr. Ben Cacatian, Ventura County Air Pollution Control District, presented the Air Quality Managment Plan including 1) the plan's purpose, 2) pollutant standards and statewide classifications, and 3) general requirements/next steps for Ventura County. He said that Ventura County's air quality is categorized as 'serious.'

SUBJECT: TTAC VOTING MEMBERSHIP DESIGNATION

RECOMMENDATION:

• Provide VCTC staff with an updated designation letter from each voting TTAC member agency, with the name or position of their appointed representative and alternate.

BACKGROUND:

The Transportation Technical Advisory Committee (TTAC) was formed in 1992 at the direction of the Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC) to "act as an advisory body to the VCTC for purposes of reviewing countywide transportation issues, preparing the local agency component of the regional transportation improvement program, and making recommendations to the VCTC regarding various transportation issues."

Since that time, the bylaws have been revised to update the number of members that comprise a quorum (2000, 2012, 2021), redefine voting and non-voting members (2012) and allow agencies to appoint their representatives to TTAC by title or by name (2012). The by-laws also specify that the representatives should be the Public Works Director, City Engineer, Transportation Director, or equivalent at their agency. Members and alternates are to be appointed in writing. Based on the 2012 bylaws revision, the voting members of TTAC are representatives of each city, of the County of Ventura, and of the Oxnard Harbor District (Port of Hueneme).

DISCUSSION:

At this time staff would like to update the TTAC files with designation letters from each agency for the purpose of maintaining accurate records and distributing TTAC related materials to the appropriate persons. Staff requests that voting member agency representatives provide VCTC staff with a letter designating either a person or position to the Transportation Technical Advisory Committee as a representative or alternate.

SUBJECT: REVISION TO PORT OF HUENEME CMAQ PROGRAM

RECOMMENDATION:

• Recommend reprogramming \$442,050 in CMAQ funds from the Yard Tractor Idle Reduction System to the Electric Vehicle and Charging Infrastructure project.

BACKGROUND:

Last year VCTC completed an expedited round of CMAQ programming based on the one-year extension of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. Funds were provided for cost increases for previously-selected projects and bus infrastructure replacement scheduled in asset management plans. In addition, agencies which did not have any current ongoing CMAQ projects were each allowed to receive funds for one new project. The Port of Hueneme submitted a list of projects and it was decided to fund the Port's request for a project to install idle reduction systems in the yard tractors. However, it has now been determined that this project is ineligible for federal funds since the yard tractors are owned by private stevedore companies. Therefore, VCTC and Port staff have agreed that the funds can best be used for another project that was on the list, which is to replace some of the vehicles owned by the Port with electric vehicles, and install vehicle chargers. Therefore, staff recommends that the TTAC approve the recommendation to reprogram the CMAQ funds from the Yard Traction Idle Reduction System to the Electric Vehicle and Charging Infrastructure project.

According to information provided by the Port, the emissions reduction for the proposed project will be 1.00 tons per year of NOx, 0.004 tons per year of PM, and 200 tons per year of CO2.
