On March 17, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order N-29-20 suspending certain provisions of the Ralph M. **INFRASTRUCTURE** 

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

 Recommend the Commission program \$11,770,451 in IIJA CMAQ funds as recommended in the Attachment A table.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

At last month's meeting the Committee approved \$11,346,444 of IIJA CMAQ funds, primarily for replacement buses and related infrastructure, to facilitate expedited spending of the newly available funds. This action was based on information provided by Committee members in response to on an item on the prior month's agenda. However, VCTC staff did not officially notify the transit operators of the available funds, and so Ojai was unaware of the request for project proposals. Ojai has now submitted a request for \$424,007 to fund 88.57% of the cost of one electric replacement bus. Staff therefore deferred bringing the issue to the Commission for the February meeting. Staff recommends the Committee amend last month's action to increase the total CMAQ funds being programmed to \$11,770,451 to accommodate Ojai's request.

The Committee should note that Ojai already has funds to acquire an electric bus to replace its one active bus currently due for replacement. However, since it is not cost-effective for Ojai to install a fast charger, and since the replacement electric bus lacks sufficient range to cover the daily schedule, it is necessary at this time for Ojai to acquire a second electric bus to maintain its regular level of service. VCTC staff therefore recommends the Committee include this project in the recommended IIJA CMAQ expedited program.

The list of recommended projects is shown in Attachment A, with the only change being to add Ojai's requested project.

SUBJECT: FARE CAPPING PASS PROGRAM

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

# **DISCUSSION:**

At the December Transcom meeting the topic of "fare capping" was discussed as a potential "fare product" option with the VCbuspass system. Having a fare capping policy means, that once a rider using a transit fare product (such as the VCbuspass) taps or pays enough times to reach the cost of a daily, weekly, or monthly pass, they are no longer charged for any additional trips for the duration of the appropriate time-period. Fare capping policies are gaining popularity across the industry as a way to improve access to discounted fare products for those riders whom paying for a monthly pass in a single purchase may be too expensive, for example.

In the case of the VCbuspass program, we currently have 31-day Pass products available. The 31-Day passes are accepted by all participating VCbuspass transit providers, except for Camarillo Area Transit. The 31-Day passes are sold in the following denominations:

31-Day Passes	<u>Price</u>
Zone 1 (Intra-county) Full	\$50.00
Zone 1 (Intra-county) Reduced	\$25.00
Zone 2 (Intercounty) Full	\$130.00
Zone 2 (Intercounty) Reduced	\$65.00

In a hypothetical scenario, a fare capping policy could be implemented with the above period-passes' pricing structure. Using the existing Zone 1 Full Fare 31-day pass as an example, if a full fare rider used their VCbuspass account to pay for \$50.00 worth of trips over the course of a given month, once they reached that point, the rider would be eligible to use their account for unlimited rides for the remainder of the month. There are additional options (time periods) to consider as well, such as a daily or weekly fare cap. Although no Day Pass or Weekly Pass products are available for purchase

today using the VCbuspass system, something like this could be added to the system, following necessary agreements regarding pricing and policy.

To further describe the potential for a fare capping policy, VCTC (Ventura County Transportation Commission) staff will provide a presentation at the Transcom meeting outlining VCbuspass system options and capabilities, potential fare policies, reimbursement formula(s), and a general update regarding VCbuspass usage and data trends since the launch July 2021.

No formal action is recommended at this time. This item is for information only to generate discussion and collect feedback from the Committee.
