VCTC Invites Public to Share Ideas on How to Improve Bus Service

CAMARILLO, Calif. – The Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC) invites the public to attend an Unmet Transit Needs community listening session or public hearing to let local government leaders hear ideas to improve bus service in Ventura County.

VCTC will host three community listening sessions and a public hearing to give community members the opportunity to tell VCTC what can be done to improve public transit and to help residents get where they need to go.
