VCTC Invites Public to Listening Sessions on Unmet Transit Needs

CAMARILLO, Calif. – The Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC) invites the public to participate in an online and in-person Unmet Transit Needs community meetings and public hearing to let local government leaders hear ideas about how to improve transit service in Ventura County. The meetings are an opportunity for community members to provide feedback on ways that VCTC can help to improve transit in Ventura County. “Each year, the annual Unmet Transit Needs process provides an opportunity for residents to share input to improve public transit in Ventura County,” said Claire Grasty, VCTC Public Transit Director. “Commute and travel patterns have changed over the last couple years and your input can help local transit operators understand how best to serve new and changed passenger needs.”
