**SUBJECT: ALLOCATION OF TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT (TDA) FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2025/26 ARTICLE 3 BIKE PATH MAINTENANCE FUNDS**

**RECOMMENDATION:**

- Approve the allocation of Fiscal Year 2025/2026 Transportation Development Act (TDA) Article 3 Bike Path Maintenance funds totaling \$243,802 as shown in Attachment “A”.

**BACKGROUND:**

Pursuant to California PUC Section 99233.3, two percent (2%) of Transportation Development Act (TDA) Local Transportation Funds are set aside for planning, constructing and maintaining bicycle and pedestrian facilities. In Ventura County, 25% of the TDA Article 3 Bicycle/Pedestrian funds are set aside for maintenance of Class I pathways based upon the proportional share of pathway miles within each jurisdiction. Class I bike paths, also termed shared-use or multi-use paths, are paved right-of-way for exclusive use by bicyclists, pedestrians and those using non-motorized modes of travel. The paths are physically separated from vehicular traffic and can be constructed in roadway right-of-way or exclusive right-of-way. The remaining 75% of the annual TDA Article 3 Bicycle/Pedestrian funding is allocated on a competitive basis.

**DISCUSSION:**

FY 2025/26 TDA Article 3 apportionment for Ventura County is \$975,210, a 2% reduction compared to last year. Of that amount, \$243,802 (25%) is available for distribution to local jurisdictions for Class I Bike Path Maintenance relative to each jurisdiction’s proportional share of Class I bike paths in Ventura County. Agencies were asked to review and update the Class I mileage information for their jurisdictions to date. The attached table “A” provides a breakdown of Class I bicycle path mileage reported by each jurisdiction and their recommended proportional share of the FY 2025/26 TDA Article 3 maintenance funds.

The approved distribution of funds will be brought to the VCTC for approval on September 5, 2025. Once approved, VCTC will submit a request to the Ventura County Auditor-Controller to disburse funds to agencies.

**SUBJECT: 101 COMMUNITIES CONNECTED**

**RECOMMENDATION:**

- Receive and file a brief update on 101 Communities Connected – a multimodal transportation study of the U.S. 101 corridor through Ventura, Oxnard, Camarillo, and Thousand Oaks. Review and provide feedback on the Project List from 2020.

**DISCUSSION**

In July 2019, with funding from the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) and Caltrans, VCTC kicked off the U.S. 101 Multimodal Corridor Study, now known as 101 Communities Connected, a plan to improve mobility for everyone who travels in the U.S. Highway 101 corridor through the cities of Ventura, Oxnard, Camarillo, and Thousand Oaks. This multimodal transportation study focused on the 28-miles long and 6-miles wide corridor (3 miles on either side) along U.S. Highway 101, where nearly half of the County's population lives and works. A multimodal corridor study is required for consideration of projects for Caltrans Senate Bill 1 (SB-1) Solutions for Congested Corridor Program funding.

The original 101 Communities Connected Projects List was provided to TTAC for review and feedback in Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-2020. The Projects List combines information from the 2020 Regional Transportation Plan, Federal Transportation Improvements Program, and Capital Improvements Plans from the four cities along the corridor and the County of Ventura. Projects are divided into four categories based on funding status (Committed / Financially Constrained), project type (Non-Transit / Transit), and a fifth category of Strategic projects that do not yet have a defined cost or completion date, using a model suggested by SCAG. The Commission approved 101 Communities Connected in December 2020.

AMENDMENT**

**RECOMMENDATION/S:**

- Recommend to the Commission approval and formal adoption of the Ventura County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Amendment.

**BACKGROUND**

The Ventura County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) is a long-range planning document originally adopted by the Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC) in 2013 to plan for the future of transportation in the County over the next 30 years. The 2023 CTP Update incorporated socioeconomic data, community priorities, and local transportation solutions, placing a special emphasis on inclusion of disadvantaged and underserved communities to create a more equitable transportation future for all.

VCTC began work on the 2023 CTP Update in Fiscal Year 2021/2022. The original CTP consultant did not have the resources or capacity to address the substantial technical comments received from local agencies and the public in December 2022. Due to requirements of the CTP Update funding source (Caltrans Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant), the project was required to go to the VCTC Board by February 2023 for review. In February 2023, the Commission voted to accept the Comprehensive Transportation Plan and directed staff to amend the Plan to incorporate comments from the public and advisory committees for full adoption at a future date.

To fully address public and agency comments on the December 2022 Draft CTP, and to incorporate the local transportation plans completed since the February 2023 Plan completion, a comprehensive review was needed. This review required additional model runs and technical support, therefore, VCTC staff sought consultant assistance to prepare the CTP Amendment. Iteris, Inc was selected to complete the CTP Amendment under VCTC's Adopted Procurement Policies and Procedures Section III - Methods of Procurement, B (Small Purchase Procedures).

Iteris completed the requested revisions to the CTP and finalized the CTP Amendment in June 2025.

## **DISCUSSION**

The CTP Amendment incorporates the feedback received from the public and technical advisory committees. Major changes to the February 2023 CTP Update include:

- Text edits for clarity
- Data-Based Proof for Plan Goals – why they are important and how can the conditions be improved
  - Example – expanded safety discussion with injuries due to collisions described for state highways and major arterials
- Updated data and information
  - Example - transit statistics (from 2020 to 2023)
  - Updated Scenario package of projects and corresponding performance
- Captures recovery post-COVID
- More concise summary of community engagement
- Added information about economic role of the transportation system in Ventura County
- Revised post-COVID travel discussion (from near-term effects to changes through 2024)

## **SUMMARY**

The multimodal transportation improvements proposed through the CTP Amendment aim to address the current and future needs of residents in Ventura County. These improvements were developed after a thorough review of existing conditions and demographic forecasts, extensive community engagement, and analysis using VCTC's regional travel demand model.

Improvements identified in the CTP Implementation Scenario (previously Scenario B) are intended to respond to existing and future mobility needs of residents in Ventura County, and to place the county on a pathway towards creating a more resilient and equitable transportation network that provides the community with access to a range of mobility choices and opportunities.

Moving forward, VCTC will complete a prioritization of the projects and strategies identified in this plan. VCTC will also continue to collaborate with local agencies and regional partners to complete the planning and pursuit of additional funding necessary for project implementation. The CTP is also intended to be a living document that will be updated and amended as needed to incorporate future planning efforts and projects identified for Ventura County.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

- Receive an update on the Community Traffic Calming & Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Program and provide feedback on the proposed temporary improvement locations.

**BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:**

VCTC launched the Community Traffic Calming and Pedestrian and Bicyclist Safety Program (**CTCP**) in February 2025. This project is funded by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) Regional Early Action Planning (REAP) County Transportation Commissions (CTC) Partnership Program (PP), through a grant to SCAG from the State of California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). The CTCP will result in educational safety campaigns and project recommendations with demonstration and preliminary engineering of safety improvement projects in five key locations.

The CTCP is moving forward with selecting five locations to complete temporary transportation improvements, with the ultimate goal of completing 30% engineering for improvements in those five locations. NN Engineering has selected ten potential locations in the County. The locations were selected using Transportation Injury Mapping System (TIMS) data to identify clusters of severe and fatal crashes in key locations, and scored for considerations such as unsafe speed collisions, pedestrian/bike travel volumes, and equity areas. The locations were then cross referenced with relevant existing plans and evaluated for items such as existing infrastructure, roads with 35mph or under, notable landmarks/key destinations nearby, etc.

The ten potential demonstration locations will be discussed during the meeting, and a survey will be distributed to each agency proposed to host a potential temporary improvement location following the discussion.
