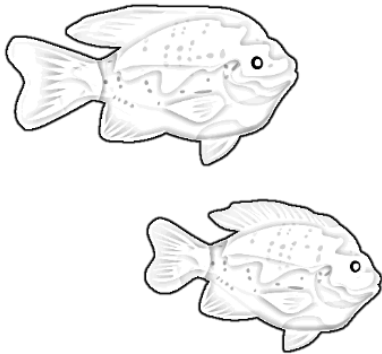


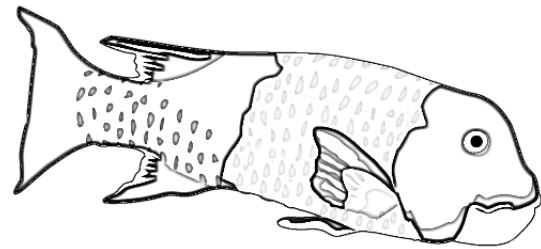


All of the fish and marine life found on our All-electric bus are native to the Southern California coastline and can be found in the kelp forests of the Channel Islands National Park.



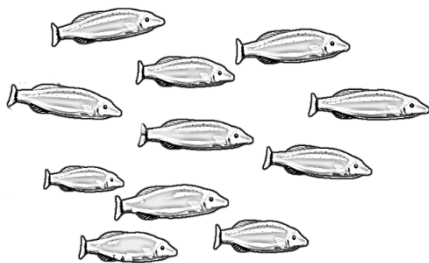
Garibaldi

The garibaldi is a member of the damselfish family and is the California State marine fish. It is easily identified by its bright red orange color.



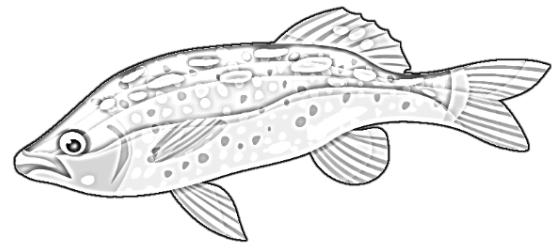
Sheephead

Sheephead can grow up to three feet long and weigh over 36 pounds. Males are much bigger than females and have a black head and tail with a pink/red middle. The females are pink with a white underside.



Señoritas

These little fish live in groups called “schools”. At night they bury themselves in the sand with only their heads exposed. These can be greenish bronze or orange.

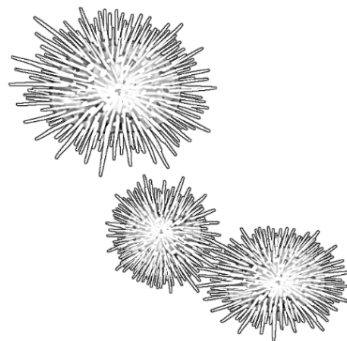


Kelp Bass

These are also called Calico Bass and can grow up to 28 inches long and 14 pounds. They can be olive green to brown with white spots.

Purple Sea Urchin

Purple sea urchins have a round body that can grow up to 4 inches in diameter. They are covered with bright purple spines that serve as protection, help with movement, and trap floating algae for them to eat.



Bat Sea Star

Sea stars use hundreds of suction-cupped feet to move and capture food, which they eat with stomachs in the center of their bodies. They can grow up to 18 inches across, they can be found in orange, yellow, red, brown, or purple.
